

FIGHT FOR YOUR RIGHTS: DIGITAL PIRACY & IP PROTECTION

Sport needs income streams that sustain its activity and ensure its long-term development. The commercialisation of sports content, in particular audiovisual rights is the main income stream and the key pillar upon which the development model of the whole sporting industry has been based over the past three decades. Regrettably, this development model is under threat, victim of continued lack of legal protection at a national and international level.

In this Webinar, we will look into this vital problem, and ask the hard questions. How deep goes the rabbit hole as far as digital piracy and cannibalisation of sports media right are concerned? What is the real magnitude and ramifications of this illegal practice? How widespread is the problem? What needs to be done? How lethal this threat is to the economic viability of Sport and its ability to pursue its social, cultural and educational role to the fullest? 10.30 CET WHAT IS ESPORTS AND HOW DOES IT FIT INTO SPORT?

There are enough similarities between Esports and sports to justify them being in the same broad category, but enough differences to justify the topic of this panel. When it comes to integrity, however, Esports behaves very much like traditional sports – it faces threats from cheating and doping to win and match-manipulation for betting fraud, but, in the absence of a meaningful overarching governing body, there are huge challenges for the industry and countering those integrity threats. Esports is approaching a \$1 billion business and the betting turnover for 2020 will exceed \$15 billion, so it's safe to say it should be at the table, especially when sports betting integrity is discussed.

INTEGRITY AND THE EMERGING SPORTS MARKET POWERED BY INDIA ON TRACK

This session will focus on multiple aspects of Sport Integrity in an emerging sport market like India. The discussion will revolve around challenges in India pertaining to policy and practice on Sporting Integrity, outlining the major hurdles faced in trying to build an integrity ecosystem. The panellists will examine the issue of "profit vs. propriety", particularly in newer leagues, and the importance of investment in integrity, in addition to the evolution of key regulations in India. 

A CLEAR AND PRESENT DANGER: SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE IN SPORT

Global awareness of Sport-related incidents of mental and physical abuse of children, young or vulnerable people, both on-and-off the field the play is steadily growing. However, despite the increasing coverage of cases on television, streaming services and via social media, this issue still does not receive the attention it needs and fully deserves. Commonly concealed and refuted, this is leaving many still vulnerable and, in the long-term, severely affected. Until now, the sporting industry has been more reactive than proactive. In the human trafficking and smuggling trade, men, women and children are defrauded, manipulated, kidnapped and lured into situations, often regarded as modern-day slavery, through various means, including Sports events. The numbers and incidents of human trafficking and smuggling associated with Sport are heavily refuted. Whilst the absence of data has raised concerns around how to quantify and tackle the criminal gangs that use Sports as a cover to carry out their activities, this cannot justify passive attitudes. This is not a new issue but progress remains slow. This panel promises will cast light of the problem, its causes and consequences, and help us determine precisely where we need to go to eradicate this issue.
